

RULES AND REGULATIONS – TO BE RUN UNDER EFA RULES

1. **DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY:** Neither the organizer, not anyone acting on their behalf, accepts liability for any loss or damage, accident, injury or illness to any horse, rider, owner or spectator, or any other person or property whatsoever.
2. All Riders must wear approved hats at all times whilst mounted.
3. The judges' decision is final and no protests will be entered into.
4. No whips or spurs and snaffle bits only to be worn in the pleasure class.
5. **NOVICE STANDARDBREDS:** Novice ridden/led/rider is a horse/rider who has not won five first ribbons [including Champions] competing in a similar class.
The organizers reserve the right to alter the program in any way at any time.
6. No dogs permitted on the grounds.
7. **Stallions** allowed in **Standardbred and Breed ring only** and all stallions/colts over the age of one year must be bitted at all times and in the care of a competent person over 18 years of age.
11. Entrants in the Standardbred ring must be registered with the SPPHAV. Presentation of SPPHAV registration card or performance card will be accepted as proof of registration. For registration details, contact Maree Lund on 9789 4475
12. Partbreds may enter classes marked with an '*'. Proof of registration for partbreds is required. Presentation of SPPHAV performance cards will be accepted as sufficient proof.
13. Winners of Novice classes ARE NOT ELIGIBLE to contest Champion awards, unless a Champion is offered as a Novice Section.
14. Age of riders to be taken as on the day of the show.

High Point System for Standardbred ring

Points will be allocated on a sliding scale depending on the number of horses in a class as follows:

First	Max 4 points Min 1 point	Champion	2 points
Second	Max 3 points Min 1 point	Reserve Champion	1 point
Third	Max 2 points Min 1 point	Supreme Champion	2 points
Fourth	1 point
